During Period 5 the Years 8,9 and 10 students did a classroom activity and the Year 7s went to the library for a guest speaker from the Youth Affairs Council. Unfortunately this young person was unable to attend but Ms Woodacre was a very capable stand-in as a guest speaker and facilitator of a workshop. The Year 7 students were fantastic and enthusiastically participated in this activity which was to address bullying and its effects.

Running these activities is part of our **whole school approach** to consistent targeted psycho-education and skill building to develop students' skills to prevent bullying behaviour at Hampton and promote help seeking and effective 'upstander' behaviour (active bystander).

To everyone who dressed up, participated in the activities, helped with the sausage sizzle and stalls, took photos, gave the students a smile, made them laugh and gave some positivity – thank you very much. Thanks also to all who supported the sausage sizzle and stalls and those who made morning tea for the staff and to everyone who attended or ran an activity during Period 5 to better arm our students with knowledge and strategies to address bullying at our school and in their worlds.

Year 10 Work Experience Dates 28 June – Friday 2 July

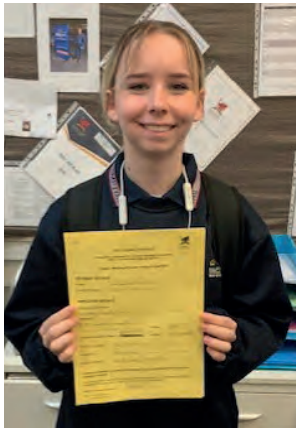
Placements were due 23 April. Aiming high, the first student to hand in work placement was Jacqueline Damasco who has organised her placement at Summit Climbing Malaga.

Camp Hero

Congratulations to Holly Micafeff who attended this camp during the holidays at the Nanga Bush Camp. Camp Hero is a leadership camp which hosts 40 of Western Australia's most inspiring Year 9 to Year 12 students. The camp is facilitated by WA-based not-for-profit organisation zero2hero.

Camp Hero equips students with the skills required to become mental health leaders and ambassadors in their community. The team of experienced mentors and facilitators will assist students in developing their understanding of the mental health arena through a series of specialised workshops and activities. Students will be encouraged to physically challenge themselves whilst at the same time learn how to communicate more proficiently and how best to care for themselves.

Participants will be selected based on their commitment to being a leader in their community and on their passion and desire to make a difference in the area of mental health. This is not a camp for mental health treatment or therapy. Students are only eligible to attend Camp Hero once.

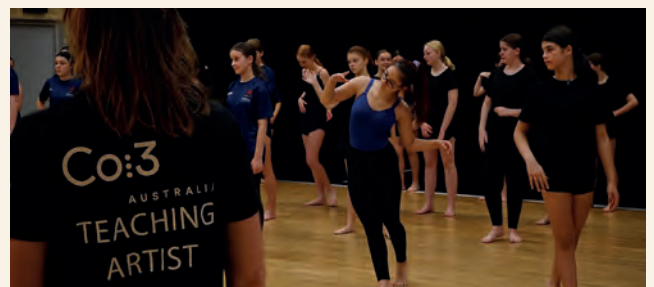

opportunity was open, the field talented, the podium awaiting something special.

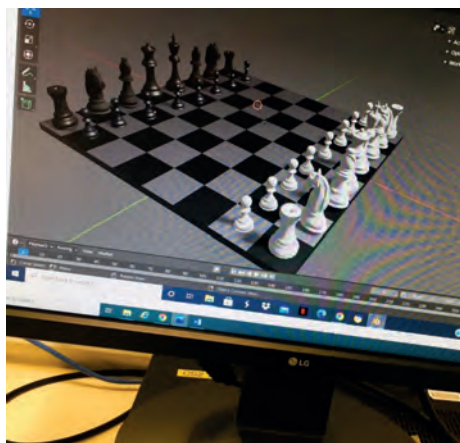
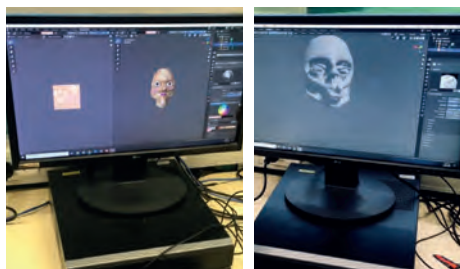

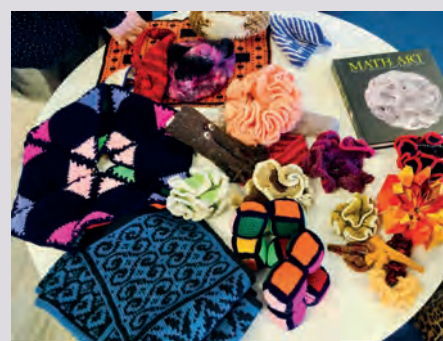
ICT

Synergy Solar Car Challenge 2021



After COVID-19 cancelled the 2020 event, four Year 8 ASP students (Jade Bizzill, Adriana Rimbis, Matthew Ahola and Cameron Quinn) represented

Hampton Senior High School at the Synergy Solar Car challenge 2021. The event, held at St Mark's Anglican College, Hilarys, saw these students in a competition against ten other schools. Under time-pressure conditions, the students were required to construct a solar car from a kit and choose the best arrangement of gears, wheel size and solar panel attitude to maximise their car's performance. Furthermore no teacher assistance was allowed.

The students chose a specialised arrangement to suit the car running under solar power. Unfortunately, the sun hid behind the clouds at the point of racing and the cars were switched over to battery power instead. This resulted in their car specifications being less favourable under this form of propulsion. Despite not getting a place, the students did a fantastic job of representing the school displaying excellent qualities of teamwork, leadership and innovation. SUBS in Schools

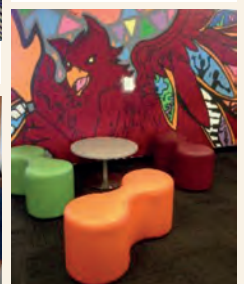
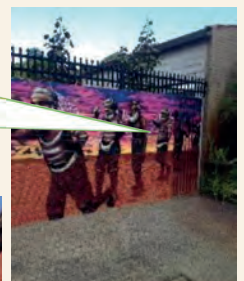
Year 7 Orientation Activity

FTD Camp December 2020

The Follow the Dream Wadandi Culture and Surf Camp was facilitated by the Undalup Association in the Margaret River region at the end of last year. We had seven FTD students from Hampton SHS and eight FTD students from Kiara College on the camp.

The group travelled from WadjakBoodja (country), through PindjarupBoodja to WadandiBoodja arriving at RAC Margaret River Nature Park. They had enough time to do some team building activities in the remaining daylight.

All the day activities began close to the bilya (river) mouth in Prevelly. On the first day Iszaac Webb welcomed the group to WadandiBoodja (on behalf of his father Wayne Webb), also telling them the dreamtime story of the landscape around. He took the students on a walk showing them the abundance of food sources and uses amongst the vegetation. After morning tea, they walked up the bilya to the caves and rock formations where they learnt further stories of the area. The group also saw and learnt about the invasive weeds that are threatening the Indigenous flora and fauna in the area. The students were delegated work cutting back and preventing seeds of the invasive weeds from spreading. The remaining weeds were measured and documented for further local work in the future. After a late lunch the students cooled off with a swim in the river.

The second day started with the students learning to surf, which was facilitated by Josh Palmateer's Surf Academy. Students learnt different aspects of the surf before they took to the water. They began familiarising themselves with the surf board on the bilya before moving to the maambakoort (ocean) with their coaches. All of the students managed to stand up riding a wave into shore during the tricky conditions. The highlight for Mr Bibby was seeing the great encouragement shown by all of the students towards each other while surfing. After morning tea, they jumped into



the kayaks and Iszaac led them paddling up the bilya (river) to another spot the Undalup Association had assisted in rejuvenating the bilya banks. They were shown more uses of the Indigenous flora and learnt further stories of the area. After lunch, the students were given the opportunity to make their own rope and a tool with Iszaac. The boys were then shown how one of the weeds can be used as fish net. Hence fishing with the net was next on the cards and the students enjoyed a swim in the bilya at the same time.

On the final night the students watched a movie about Eddie Koiki Mabo. It detailed how Mabo's actions along with assistance lead to the High Court decision, which enabled all First Nations People to put in their claims for Native Title.

Chess or cards were probably the winners of games in the evenings. Miss Cullen made sure that everyone was very well fed over the duration of the camp.. Thanks to Miss Cullen and Jody for running some of the activities on the camp and for their overall support during the camp. Also a big thank you to Carol Quartermaine (Nanna Carol) for assisting and volunteering her time on the camp.
