


School Ball

SUBS in Schools

Students in the Year 10 Underwater Engineering class have been hard at work developing their ROV designs and commencing the construction of their ROVs in preparation for the State Finals being held at the end of Term 3. As part of the design and team management process, students have participated in a workshop on developing their team brand, as well as listening to industry experts share their experience working on ROV projects. Early in Term 2, the students were given an opportunity to visit Elite Graphix in Osborne Park where they were given a tour of their workshop and had the opportunity to receive feedback on their team logo designs from a graphics designer and the managing director of Elite Graphix. In the second half of Term 2, students had the opportunity to listen to a presentation from the director of Innovative Solutions Plus explain how ROVs were designed and operated in industry.









Resources **Technologies** Showcase 2021

Four of our students who had previously competed in the SUBS in Schools competition were invited to discuss their experiences working on the project as part of the Defense Industries presentation on STEM at the Resources Technologies Showcase at the Perth Convention and Exhibition Centre. The students spent the day exploring the various exhibits at the showcase while also assisting at the SUBS in Schools display at the Defense Industries booth where they talked to students about the program and what they had learnt in the project. ITC

Year 8 General ICT students have been creating a wire loop game using a small, credit card-sized computer called the 'micro:bit'. The micro:bit powers the loop and is programmed by the students to keep count of the number of times the player touches the wire loop with the wire probe. A great way to combine Science and ICT in a game while learning.

Year 12 Art Excursion






