Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) Program

Hampton SHS is proudly implementing the PBS program throughout our school. We are currently prioritising the implementation of this in Years 7-9. Our goal is to ensure that teachers can focus on student engagement, explicit teaching and high impact teaching strategies through consistent implementation of positive behaviour strategies as well as clear processes and consequences. This will result in increased student engagement, progress and achievement, and facilitate confidence from families regarding our pastoral care processes.

Rowan Brookes has taken up a "special project" Deputy role for the semester, working with our new Student Services Manager, Danielle Larkin, Instructional Coach and PBS Leader, Caroline Dixon and the Year 7, 8, 9 Year Coordinators, to fully support classroom behaviour management and implementation of PBS. Christine Colameo will step into the HOLA HPE role for Mr Brookes.
